Identification Case Trends

• e.g., prong I – ED

 e.g., prong 2 – adverse effect and educational performance

• yet to come – RTI cases for SLD

FAPE, LRE and Related Services Case Trends

- e.g., largely FAPE cases
- e.g., Rowley two-pronged test
- e.g., overlap with tuition reimbursement category
- e.g., predominance of autism cases

FAPE, LRE and Related Services Case Trends (Cont.)

- e.g., *Oberti* two-step, multi-factored test for LRE
- e.g., state law for related services to private school students

Discipline and Attorneys' Fees Case Trends

• e.g., PINS intersection

- e.g., effect of Buckhannon
- e.g., effect of Arlington Central

Remedies Case Trends

 e.g., tuition reimbursement > compensatory education > money damages
